Starting June 3, 2019, IAL will be defaulting to electronic delivery as the standard delivery option for all reports.

- Requested EDDs (HAZSITE SRP, NY EQUIS, etc.)
- Final Report in PDF

can be easily downloaded and managed through our industry leading online data management system at www.ialonline.com. Once all reports have been completed, you will receive an email that your report is ready for download.

If website access is needed or if paper reports are required, they can be requested through your sales/client services representatives or by emailing us at help@ialonline.com. Website access is available at no charge. All unbound paper reports will be assessed a fee of \$25 for the first 100 pages and \$0.15 per page after. Bound reports will no longer be offered. CDs will be assessed a \$25 fee per project.

IAL is now certified for SW-846 3570 – Microscale Solvent Extraction

After years of research led by IAL's Laboratory Director, Michael Leftin, PhD, IAL is the first lab in NJ to move to a microscale approach for extraction of PCBs, Pesticides, and DRO soil samples. Data are not compromised by this new approach, with LCS recoveries being comparable to that of SW-846 3545 and 3550. The microscale approach minimizes sample size and solvent usage, thereby reducing health and safety issues, waste generated, and overall environmental impact.
